

FACTS**WHAT DOES INVESTORS DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?**

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.	
What?	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social Security number • Income • Account balances • Payment history • Transaction history • Credit history 	
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Investors chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Who is providing this notice?	The privacy notice applies to Investors Bank and its affiliates
What We Do	
How does Investors protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We also maintain other physical, electronic and procedural safeguards to protect this information and we limit access to information to those employees for whom access is appropriate.
How does Investors collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information, for example, when you <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open an account • Pay your bills • Use your credit or debit card • Deposit money • Apply for a loan We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes - information about your creditworthiness • affiliates from using your information to market to you • sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.
What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone on your account.
Definitions	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Our affiliates include financial companies with a common corporate name of Investors, such as Investors Financial Group, Inc., and Investors Financial Group Insurance Agency, Inc.,</i>
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Investors does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</i>
Joint Marketing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Our joint marketing partners include investment and insurance and credit card service providers.</i>
Other Important Information	
California Residents	Except as permitted by law, we will not share information we collect about you with affiliates or joint marketing partners while you are a resident of California.
Vermont Residents	We will not disclose information about your creditworthiness to our affiliates and will not disclose your personal information, financial information, credit report, or health information to nonaffiliated third parties to market to you, other than as permitted by Vermont law, unless you authorize us to make those disclosures.
